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Representation: I do not consider that it is in the best interest of the islands to transfer staff accommodation to private residential properties within the town. Wherever possible staff accommodation should contuinue to be provided where there can be no possibilty of causing disruption to residential neighbours. Wherever possible it should be 'onsite' of their place of work where a level of behaviour can be assured. It is well known that seasonal catering staff can generally only socialise after their working hours which is more than often late at night and into the early hours. The nature of such socialising can and often does lead to high spirits, loud music and anti-social behaviour with little or no consideration for neighbours within the local area. Whilst not wishing to be a 'killjoy' and appreciating that everyone is entitled to socilaise after work, consideration for those permanent residents wishing to sleep and who often have work the next morning must put first. However, such condiderations are often forgotten or not considered by occupants of temporary accommodation, as at the end of the season they will move on. I consider the use of 'Treboeth' which is set in the heart of a residential area is an inappropriate location for a staff house of temporary multi-occupancy. In my opinion 'staff' accommodation already exists within 'Tregarthens' and this should not be removed in favour of 'self-catering' appartments.
