Further to the submission of the above application, as you may be aware your application will be presented to Members for a decision at Full Council on December 17<sup>th</sup>.

Whilst I have concluded the proposal is acceptable and is therefore recommended for approval I am aware that Members may be inclined to ask (at the meeting) what sustainability enhancements are proposed. I have concluded (which is set out in my report) that

requiring such enhancements would be disproportionate to what is proposed, but it would be useful to understand whether you have investigated any measures that seek to reduce energy or water consumption? In my experience and as you may also be aware, Members consider that planning applications of Officers and Members of the Council should be setting a standard that we would be expecting from everyone, particularly when works proposed result in enhancements to the quality of accommodation and/or value of the property. If you have not considered the installation of solar or other energy reducing/generating installations or similar water saving/reduction measures for the property, should members be inclined to recommend a 'Sustainable Design Measures' condition, which would likely pre-commencement, do you consider that you would be likely to accept such a condition?

As a matter of consistency and to reflect both the emerging policies of the Local Plan and changes to the National Planning Policy
Framework, development proposals should be seeking to achieve measurable net-gains in biodiversity... through the provision for example of bat boxes or bird boxes. This is being requested of applicants currently to reflect the greater weight we are giving to emerging policies. Whilst again I think the scale of development proposed is modest, it would be useful to understand whether you are able to make any provision to this affect. I wonder if you have any comments in relation to this?
