Comments:

Access and Facilities for the Fire Service as detailed in B5 ADB Volume 1 will be required. For dwellinghouses access for a pumping appliance should be provided to within 45m of all points inside the dwellinghouse.

It is important to remember that failure to do so may prevent the applicant from obtaining a completion certificate under the Building Regulations but more importantly, the lives of the occupiers will be put at risk.

Holiday Rental Advice.

I note the proposal seeks to change the use of ancillary buildings into holiday rentals.

The Responsible Person should ensure the proposal complies with current Fire Safety Legislation and Guidance as this differs from Building Regulations before being used as holiday rentals.

The current layout of the proposed buildings does not appear to comply with current fire safety legislation or guidance due to the bedrooms being inner rooms and the means of escape having to pass through the kitchen area (high risk room) to reach a final exit.

Please also consider escape windows are not recognised as a suitable means of escape within fire safety legislation or guidance.
