Access and Facilities for the Fire Service as detailed in B5 ADB Volume 1 will be required. For dwellinghouses access for a pumping appliance should be provided to within 45m of all points inside the dwellinghouse.

It is important to remember that failure to do so may prevent the applicant from obtaining a completion certificate under the Building Regulations but more importantly, the lives of the occupiers will be put at risk.

Holiday Rental Advice

I note from this proposal that Dolphin House is a holiday rental. The applicant/Responsible Person should ensure Dolphin House complies with current Fire Safety Legislation and Guidance as this

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differs from Building Regulations. The Fire Risk Assessment will need to be amended to take account of the proposed alterations.

The proposed escape route from the first floor bedrooms via the open plan hall will not be deemed satisfactory under the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005. Either an alternative means of escape that does not pass through the open plan area on the ground floor or a protected route to the final exit on the ground floor will be required to satisfy the Order.
