- 1. The first photo is of my wife arms out stretched between the fence of no.8 Branksea close and the fence of Men-A-Vaur. I can not see how the builder will get building materials through this narrow gap, let alone JCB'S, skips and other plant. It is totally irresponsible for the builder to use this way as a means of access to the site, and as far as I can see there is no viable way to access the site from any boundary.
- 2. The second photo is taken by the lamp post in Branksea close, this shows where the proposed entrance (according to the plans) will be to the site. I wish to point out directly behind the lamp post and just on the other side of the hedge is an **Ancient Pear Tree** which should be preserved.

I can not see how this planning application can go ahead.
