1.My husband and I own flat 1 Rosevean House and we are very worried about the sewerage and rainwater issue, which has not been addressed on the plans, except water buts (we cannot see that they will be emptied by guests to water the garden.) There are no proper drains, just soak aways and we in flat 1 and our neighbour flat 4 have already been inundated with (raw) sewage from Man A Vaur before the new build (our flats are on the ground floor). The plans do not mention any new drains, pipes etc. The sewage situation (the slope is down from Man A Vaur towards the church), flooding and sewage would render flat 1 and flat 4 inhabital for a long time if a major clean op operation has to start.

2.We are also worried about any loss of archaeology. You know the proximity of neolithic burial tombs, above and behind the power station. According to old maps of Silly there were orchards were the current properties are. I assume that no archeological digs have take place ever here.
