I submit further detailed archaeological impact assessment of the proposed development. I have read and understood "The setting of heritage assets" by Historic England, (2nd 12/17). The visual impact is affected by the eastern aspect only. Photo 4 shows a small encroachment of the site (obscured by trees). In my opinion the visual impact of the development, particularly from the southern aspect, will be beneficial. The rise in roof height is proportional to the rise in ground level. The change of an ugly building to that similar to Island Grn, I believe is more sympathetic to the local surroundings. Any changes to sound or smell will also be beneficial. The development of the existing wood working facility will have new upgraded machines, reducing any noise and vibration, with additional dust extraction within the building. The new block and granite frontage will also aid in noise reduction. I submit additional drawing for the south wall foundation and sewage soil pipe to the road. I hope this is sufficient to allow planning to proceed.

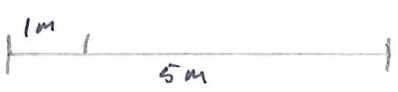
