In my opinion the visual impact of the development, particularly from the southern espect, will be benefical. the raise in roof height is proportional to the rise in ground level. the change of an ugly building to that similar to Island Gin, I below is more sympathetic to the local sorroundings, any changes to sound or smell will also be benefical- The development of the existing wood working facility will have new upgraded machines; Reducing any noise and vikration, with additional dust extraction within the building. The new block and granite frontage will also aid in noise reduction. I submit additional drawing for the south wall foundation and sawage soil pipe to the road. I hope this is sufficient to allow planning to proceed.
