Flood Warning & Evacuation Plan

For The Chandlery, The Thorofare, St Mary's, Isles of Scilly, TR21 OLN



Introduction

This Flood Warning & Evacuation Plan (FWEP) has been produced by the property owner in respect of the property known as The Chandlery, in The Thorofare, St Mary's, Isles of Scilly. The Property owner owns the FWEP, is responsible for its implementation, dissemination and annual review.

The FWEP captures a summary of the site's flood risk, taking into account flood mitigation measures incorporated in the design of the property, and provides all relevant information, contact details and procedures to prepare for, respond to and recover from a flood event.

The property owner has given due regard to the safety of resident/s, responding organisations, available best practice, relevant legislation and advice provided by the emergency services, and the Emergency Planning dept of the Council for the Isles of Scilly.

Objectives

In the production of this FWEP the property owner has identified the following key objectives:

- To encourage residents to sign up to <u>Flood Warnings Direct</u> and <u>Weather Warnings</u>;
- To provide for and signpost clear evacuation routes for residents;
- To ensure adequate ingress and egress for the emergency services; and
- Reduce the risk to life and damage to property.





PROPERTY FLOOR PLANS




Evacuation

The decision to evacuate or take shelter ultimately rests with the resident/s, but must be made to allow sufficient time to conduct the evacuation before flooding occurs. Flood waters contain hidden dangers and will impede, if not prevent, a safe evacuation.

Where you are unable to identify or access alternative accommodations a safe place of refuge should be sought from the Council for the Isles of Scilly / Emergency Services.

You are advised not to assume that the emergency services will be able to assist you with the evacuation; their focus will be directed to those in greatest need.

Where evacuation is not a feasible option, or has been delayed, you should remain on the first floor of the property; taking/keeping with you any important documents, bottled water, essential medicines and food sufficient to support you until rescue.

Warning & informing

The Council for the Isles of Scilly and the emergency services encourage you to sign up to Flood Warnings Direct (FWD) from the Environment Agency and to Weather Alerts from the Meteorological Office and to act upon the guidance provided.
