

## Higher Moors accessible hide replacement Site Waste Management Plan

## Part 1 – Construction waste

It is not anticipated there will be any amount of construction waste generated with this project. Our contractors, who are specialists in bird hide construction, build the sections of the hide on the mainland, using sustainably-sourced timber. The hide sections will then be flat-packed for shipping to the Isles of Scilly. The anticipated volume of the construction waste to be produced is 0 m<sup>3</sup>

If, in some exceptional case due to reasons beyond reasonable control, it is required to cut pieces of timber on-site, our contractors have a policy to reuse off cuts in manufacturing, and any pieces too small for manufacturing are used to provide heating in their workshops during the winter.

If, again in some exceptional case, there are large sections of timber which are not required for the hide, the Isles of Scilly Wildlife Trust will transport these to the Trust's workshop and they will be repurposed for future projects, such as use by the Men in Sheds voluntary group which meet at the workshop each week and create assets for the community. In this case no disposal would be required.

## Part 2 – Waste storage

As above, it is not anticipated that any waste will be generated in this project. If, in some exceptional case, there are small off cuts of timber, these will be transported away from the site after each work day and stored in the Isles of Scilly Wildlife Trust workshop. Therefore there will be no waste stored on site or that needs collecting.
